



Under the parsonage, there is water pooling in the corner of basement/crawl space. Tommy Smith will investigate the problem to see what, if any, repairs needed.

The ceiling above stairs on the West wall of Fellowship Hall leading to the second floor Sunday School rooms is crumbling. Tommy Smith will investigate the problem and recommend needed repairs.

When the weather is warmer, the sprinkler system needs to be evaluated.

One of the pine trees in the playground area needs to be removed. It was struck by lightning a few years ago and has subsequently died. It poses possible damage and needs to be removed.
