





April has been a busy month for Scouting! Both the Pack and the Troop have been involved in several activities and requirements. The dens in Pack 69 have been working on their Champions of Nature elective: focusing on natural resources, renewable and non-renewable resources, recycling, and composting. They dedicated one night to study the water cycle and understand Monticello's Wastewater system. Additionally, they visited the UAM Museum and Planetarium with Dr. Bramlett, learning about snakes, fish, deer, bears, Arkansas crystals, and our galaxy. They even experienced a virtual trip to the moon and back. The Champions of Nature elective requirements were completed on April 28 with discussions on Air Pollution and Pollination. A few members of the Pack attended the De Soto District Derby Weekend at Camp De Soto April 25-26 where they were able to participate in a Fishing Derby, Range & Target activities, STEM movement experiments, and a District Pinewood Derby. The final Pack meeting for this school year will be on May 5, featuring ice cream and awards presentations. We will also be sharing summer camp opportunities at Camp De Soto.



Due to weather conditions, several events with the Troop were postponed and rescheduled for later in April. Despite this, they have been diligently working with our Young Scouts to earn their first rank of "Scout." Many of our older Scouts are working on merit badges in Citizenship of the Community or Communications, which require attending a community meeting such as Quorum Court. The Troop attended the April meeting and learned about the debates and discussions before major equipment purchases. Additionally, the Troop participated in the De Soto District Spring Camporee with a Medieval theme, and a workday at Camp De Soto, where they cleaned, moved, or created new trails, cleared trees at several campsites, and thoroughly cleaned the dining hall and Berry Building with Pine Sol. During the Spring Camporee Troop 67 took home the overall winner's stone award for "The Conquers of De Soto" and the GOLDEN SPOON for the Dutch Oven Dessert Competition. Some Troop members volunteered to assist with the Cub Scout Derby weekend at Camp De Soto at the end of the month. We have continued our meetings with Mr. John McClendon, focusing on the Personal Management Merit Badge. Our next meeting will be on May 5, where we will discuss Summer Camp options and plan our meetings through June 15. After Summer Camp, the Troop will take a break until school resumes in August.





Ten of our members traveled to Baldwin, LA, to spend a week volunteering at the Sager Brown UMCOR Depot. It was not all food and games! However, we enjoyed both. Pallets of cleaning buckets and health kits were inspected, assembled, prayed over, and made ready for shipment to a disaster area when needed. Several members also served one day in the community helping sort clothing at the St. Mary resale shop. Bro. Bryan started our day with a devotion and our week ended with a worship service in Jubilee Hall. We would LOVE to have you join us next year March 15 - 20, 2026.
