

# Reflections

September 2026



Dear Church Family,

As we enter the month of September, there is a sense of newness all around us. A new season of ministry is beginning, children and young people are settling into a new school year, and our church family has opportunities once again to grow together in faith and service.

This fall, I am especially excited about two opportunities for spiritual growth and renewal.

Our new Sunday morning sermon series, “**The Christ-Centered Life**,” will explore what it means to place Jesus Christ at the very center of our daily lives. The series will draw especially from the wisdom and ministry of E. Stanley Jones, the renowned Methodist missionary and evangelist whose life was devoted to helping people discover the transforming power of Christ.

Jones consistently called people beyond simply believing *about* Christ toward actually allowing Christ to shape the whole of life. His emphasis on Christ-centered living is a timely message for us today. In a world filled with competing voices, demands, anxieties, and distractions, what would happen if Christ truly became the center of our thoughts, relationships, decisions, work, worship, and service?

That question will guide us throughout this sermon series. My prayer is that these messages will not simply give us something to think about on Sunday mornings, but will invite each of us into a deeper and more intentional relationship with Christ.

I also want to invite you to a special **six-week pastor study featuring the movie *A Great Awakening***. This study will provide an opportunity to consider the history, challenges, and spiritual significance of revival and awakening, while reflecting together on what God may be calling the church to be and to become in our own time.

The study will begin **September 13** and continue for six weeks. There will be two opportunities to participate each week:

**Sundays at 5:30 p.m.**

**Mondays at 1:00 p.m.**

The Sunday and Monday gatherings will provide the same study, allowing you to choose the time that works best for your schedule. I hope you will make plans to join us for this meaningful time of learning, conversation, prayer, and reflection.

Perhaps these two opportunities belong together more than we might first realize. A Christ-centered life and a spiritually awakened church are deeply connected. Renewal in the church begins as Christ renews us individually. As our hearts are drawn more fully toward Christ, we become more attentive to the movement of the Holy Spirit, more willing to serve others, and more ready to participate in God's work in the world.

My hope for this fall is not simply that we will have another sermon series or another study on the church calendar. My prayer is that we will experience a deeper hunger for Christ and a renewed openness to what God desires to do among us.

May this be a season in which we place Christ at the center, seek God with renewed hearts, and discover again the joy of being the people God has called us to be.

I look forward to sharing this journey with you.

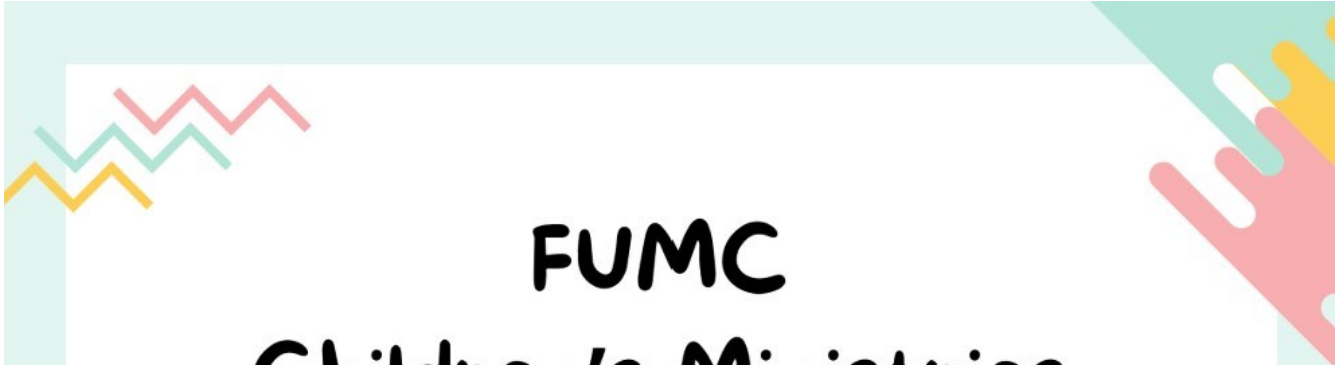

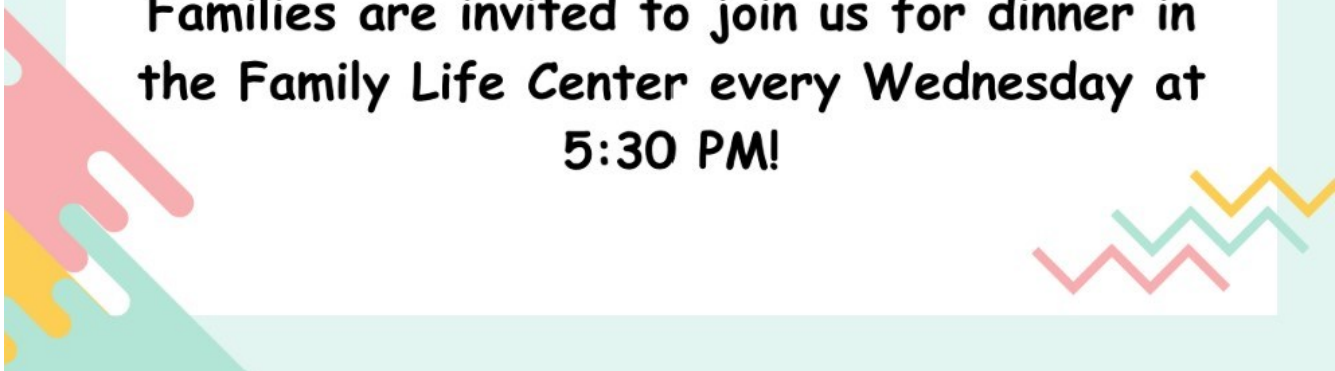

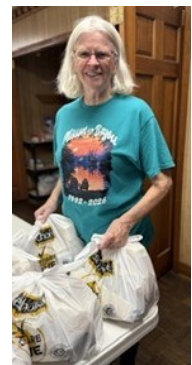

## Sole Purpose



What many don't realize is that Sole Purpose is a year round mission! Yes, we have a major event each fall when we invite our school children and their families into our church where we serve them. It is a day of rejoicing for them and for us, as well. But, throughout the year, as families need the additional help, all they have to do is call our church and we make sure the children have what they need.

It is also a year round event because of all the months of planning and implementing. We have church members picking up coats from the schools and washing them in preparation for our fall event. We have members going to Options to pick up books, collecting and sorting them so they are ready to share with these children. Teams order coats and shoes, sometimes making trips to Little Rock and other places to find these items at a price we can afford. In July applications are created, printed and taken to the schools to be shared with parents at the schools' open houses. And so much more—all kinds of activity as we get ready for our day of sharing.

And now is our MAJOR fund-raising time. In an effort to make fund-raising easier on families, the few months before our Sole Purpose event, we have taken a collection during our Communion time. We only have two more collection times before the heavy duty purchasing begins. We try to raise at least \$8,000 each year. This year we have raised approximately \$6,000 to date. The good news is that we still have two more months! So we ask that you prayerfully consider making a donation sometime during the next two months. We are coming up on 10 YEARS of taking care of our children! And we will continue to do this as long as we can.

We have already begun purchasing coats and shoes for this year.

Meeting was brought to order at 6:00 PM by Michael Blazier. Rev. Bryan Diffie opened the meeting with prayer.

**Motion:** to accept the July meeting minutes as presented by Amanda Gilbert seconded by John Kidwell. All in favor. None opposed.

### **Old Business:**

- The employees of Freedom Accessibility were interviewed by the police, but the owner, Keith Cook, was not there. It is going to come down to intent. If there is intent, criminal; if no intent, civil. (See July 2026 minutes for original quote.)
- Steven Harvey is very busy and will work on the bus when he has more time. Anthony Brown said he knows someone who can take off the logos and will speak with him.
- The A/C on the third floor above the Fellowship Hall has been replaced.
- Ken Hunter is waiting for rain to figure out where the roof is leaking.
- Further discussion on Social Justice Fund. (See July 2026 Executive Council meeting minutes for more information.) Fund would be used to help individuals with Immigration issues. The funds would not be used for criminal charges.
- A committee of members in the congregation with a heart for people and a legal background will be formed as well as looking at the United Methodist Church to see if there is a social justice or advocacy group that we can use as a guide.

**Motion:** Move to set up a social justice committee for the purpose of reviewing and distributing funds on a case-by-case basis for any social justice needs that may arise made by Jaime Hunter and seconded by Amanda Gilbert. *After further discussion, motion tabled while more information is gathered.*

### **New Business:**

- During a storm, there was a lightning strike, and the phones and other electronics were struck. The phone system was destroyed, and Precision Alarm was contacted for a quote on replacing the system. The quoted cost was \$6,100. Instead, a new system was purchased from Office Depot at a cost of under \$600, and we are waiting for Precision Alarm to repair the damage to the phone infrastructure.
- Michael Reed spoke with an electrician, John David Kellum, regarding the wiring for the projectors. Cables need to be re-run before new projectors can be purchased and installed. New surge protectors need to be installed also.
- Monthly, funds were put in Special Funds to pay insurance. Lynne Russell now pays insurance through the conference when apportionments are paid. The \$816.73 in Special Funds will be moved back to the general fund.
- Rev. Lori Fallon brought up the condition of the flooring of the second-floor bathrooms above the Fellowship Hall and suggested that the Executive Council make a visual inspection of them.

## EXECUTIVE COUNCIL NOTES CONT.

### **SPRC:**

- Michelle Oler gave her resignation, and her last day was August 15, 2026.
- We need to advertise for a new janitor soon. Lori Fallon and Lynne Russell are cleaning until a replacement can be found. Tracy Phillips and Cricket Cleaning were proposed to contact.

### **Trustee Report:**

- Waiting for Ken Hunter to diagnose leaks in Family Life Center.
- Ken Hunter quoted \$2000 to repair decking boards and lattice on parsonage deck.

**Motion:** to accept quote for repairs to the parsonage deck lattice and decking boards that need replacement from Ken Hunter in the amount of \$2000. All in favor. None opposed.

### **Finance Report:**

- Lynne Russell presented the Financial Reports and Special Accounts.

**Motion:** to approve the July financial report made by John Kidwell and seconded by Jaime Hunter. All in favor. None opposed.

### **Senior Pastor Report:**

- First Staff meeting after the summer break. Only three of the staff do not work for the school systems.
- Trying to figure out a better day and time to hold staff meetings so that more can attend.
- The Charge Conference for 2026 will be here on October 25, 2026 @ 3:00 PM. Along with FUMC's charge conference, there will be other churches having their meeting here that day. There will be an opportunity to pack food for food pantries as a mission opportunity.
- The due date for the 2026 Charge Conference Packet is October 5, 2026; so, at the September Executive Council meeting, all reports need to be finalized and signed.
- Two Bible studies will be offered before the end of the year. One study will begin on Sunday, September 13 and Monday, September 14 and continue for six weeks on Sundays at 5:30 and Mondays at 1:00 PM and then an Advent study to follow.
- One last thing: I would like to see a mission opportunity happen. John Mpandi in Uganda has upwards of 75 people comprised of staff from his orphanage and the children in the orphanage that watch FUMC services every week from his phone. To provide a tent, chairs, a big-screen television, internet, and a PA system would cost about \$10,000. How can we make this happen? Eventually John Mpandi would like to purchase land and build a structure. That would cost roughly \$160,000 but would be a permanent structure for the orphanage.

Ideas: an envelope fundraiser, show video from John Mpandi and children to congregation, special offering, and check with Methodist church in Uganda to see if there is help there.
